Tuskegee University News

Tuskegee University President Temporarily Takes a Leave of Absence



Tuskegee University Board of Trustees Chair Norma Clayton announced that President Lily D. McNair, PhD will be taking a medical leave starting on January 15, 2020 and lasting for most of the spring semester. The details of President McNair's request will remain private.

In Dr. McNair's absence, the Board of Trustees has appointed Dr. Ruby L. Perry, the dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine and a Tuskegee alumna, as acting president. To ensure continuity, Dr. Perry will update the Board of Trustees Chair on the same weekly schedule as Dr. McNair has since the start of her presidency. In addition, the President's Office will provide the university community with

semi-monthly updates on major activities, initiatives and accomplishments.

Dr. McNair is fully committed to returning to her presidential duties upon her recovery. The university's day-to-day executive-level operations are in the hands of a full complement of cabinet leaders with the recent additions of Joseph Montgomery as vice president of enrollment management and student success, and Dr. Kimberly Scott, as vice president of student affairs. The search for a permanent provost will be delayed, extending Dr. Carla Jackson Bell's tenure as interim provost into the summer months.

The Tuskegee National Alumni Association (TNAA) President, Burt Rowe, recently communicated the goals of TNAA for 2020. In 2019, TNAA's local clubs in all five regions (North Central, Northeastern, Southeastern, Southwestern, & Western) were successful in supporting Tuskegee University in recruiting freshman students to the university. TNAA's five regions of local clubs were effective in providing academic scholarships to hundreds of deserving students. TNAA's Adopt-A-Dorm program reached its highest contributions of \$352,000.00 that

included alumni labor materials, to renovate portions of three dormitories throughout the month of July 2019. TNAA goals for 2020 are to improve on the following metrics:


The President Signs HBCU Funding Bill

Howard University's President on Why America Needs HBCUs - The Atlantic



The President of Howard University, Wayne Frederick, spoke with The Atlantic to discuss the continued importance and need of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) in today's environment. Several key data and statistics provide context for the continued need of HBCUs. Even though HBCUs account for three percent of four-year nonprofit colleges, the alumni of these institutions account for about eighty percent of black judges and fifty percent of black lawyers and doctors. And their students account for twenty-five percent of black undergraduates who earn degrees in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics).
