2022 Financial Highlights: In 2022, we were able to build on our 2021 success, exceed our expectations and create more revenue. Through your help and the help of our community, this allowed us to have more capital than in the past and give more resources and value to local area Tuskegee University (TU) students, alumni, and our communities in the midst of a global pandemic. Below are just a few highlights that we were able to accomplish this year.

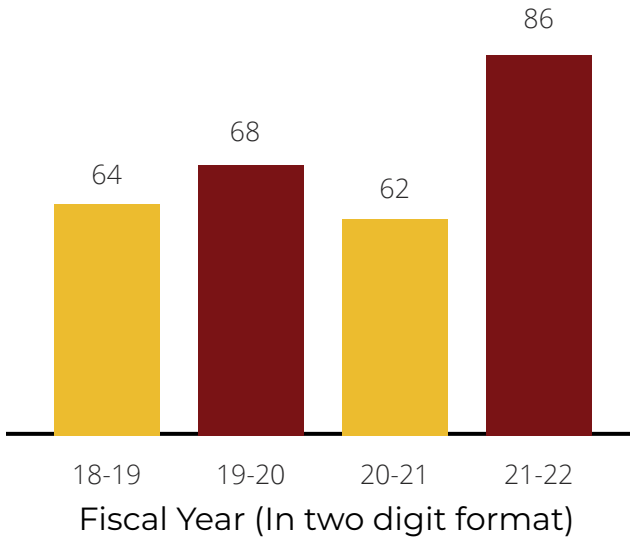
Operating Capital: We had an 87.99% increase in total operating capital at the end of June 2022 compared to the end of June 2021 and generated \$20,380.22 in total operating capital revenue which is 118.87% higher as well compared to \$9,311.50 in June 2021. This increase in operating capital revenue was generated from support by many through four key areas: donations, fundraisers, events, and membership dues. The increase in the number of members led to a 78.46% increase from last fiscal year in operational funds from membership dues. The increase in operating capital from dues have allowed us to more comfortably operate, while providing additional resources for growing programs. With the additional operating capital revenue, we were able to continue building student initiatives and activities such as care packages and meet-and-greets for our current local Tuskegee students. The student activities have led to an increase in value in the lives of our local Tuskegee students that have had students, parents, and members raving. The increased capital also allowed us to create value and events for all, especially our members such as membership appreciation events and discounts, while still covering all necessary operating expenditures.

Scholarship Assets: As far as our scholarship assets, we were able to reach our highest mark in scholarship fund balance in the last 8 years with the aid of the 2021-2022 fiscal year's scholarship donations of \$17,901.69. This amount was 38.32% higher than last fiscal year's scholarship donations. This represents positive growth in scholarship donations for the last three years. All during a global pandemic.

Overall: Although our market investments did decrease by 12.30% compared to last fiscal year, we ended with a positive net revenue for the third year in a row. Additionally, our pre-fiscal year membership revenue, dues received before the fiscal year starts, exceeded last fiscal year's mark at 34.23% as well. Pre-fiscal year membership revenue is BIG because this allows us to more effectively budget and plan for the future, while building on a successful 2021-2022 fiscal year. This will enable us to create new opportunities in the 2022-2023 fiscal year to serve all Tuskegee students, members, alumni, and our communities better one step at a time. We are on the right track!!!

The Mission of the Scholarship Committee is to provide financial assistance to young men and women from the Washington DC metropolitan area attending Tuskegee University in pursuit of their academic and career goals. Our Vision is to help future and current DC metro area students by enriching and empowering their college and academic career goals and forming lifelong relationships. The scholarship committee awarded 19 scholarships in the amount of \$40,200 for the 2021 School Year. The scholarship amounts ranged from \$1200.00 - \$2600.00.

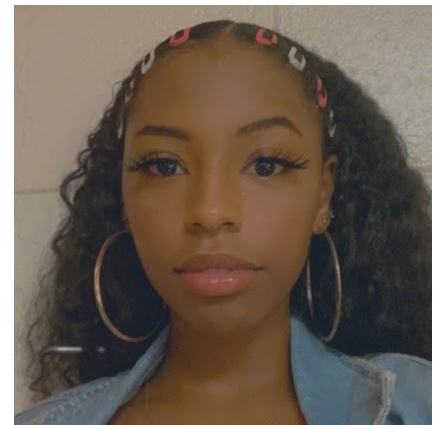

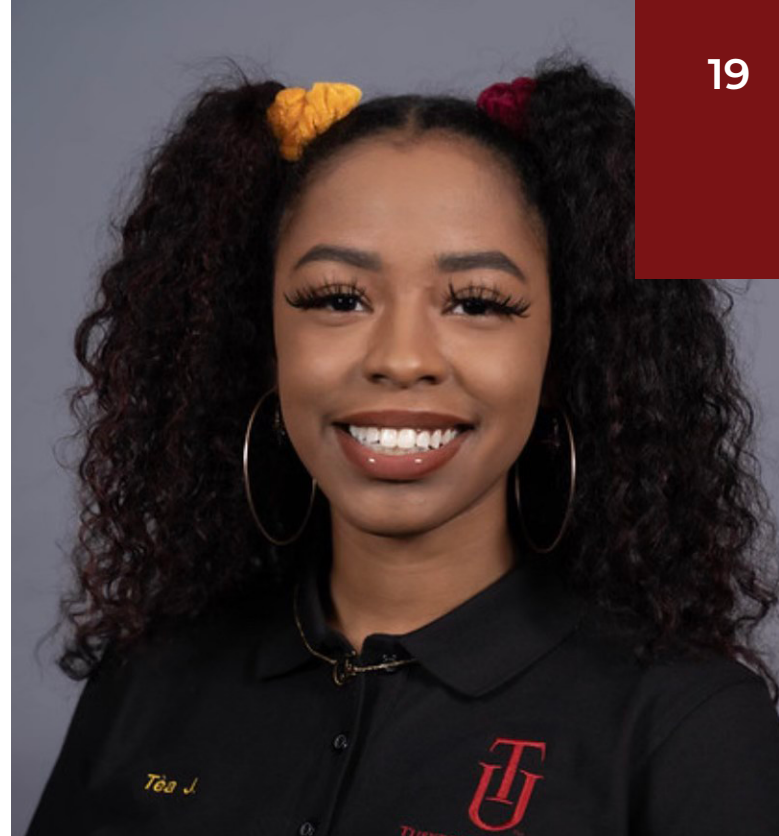

Te'a Jeffries is a third generation Golden Tiger majoring in Agribusiness. Her freshman year at Tuskegee University she became a member of the Underclassmen Leadership Academy (ULA). ULA is an interactive leadership program designed to establish courageous student leaders and build a firm foundation for effective future leadership. She is an integral part of a movement to increase student participation in events going on around campus, such as elections and other campus opportunities. Te'a was selected to a competitive appointment as a TU Student Recruiter. She works with the Office of Admissions and Recruitment giving tours and informational sessions to prospective students. She also served as



a speaker during the 2020 Virtual Homecoming and was a panelist for the Legacy Student Panel Session for prospective families, giving perspective on her experience as a freshman coming from a family of TU graduates.

Te'a has always had an entrepreneurial spirit since she was younger. While in college, she noticed that some students needed help with their collegiate studies. MEMBERSHIP FACTS & FIGURES



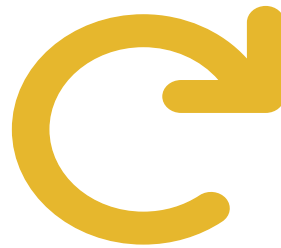
